



Minor and machinery in nature	<p>The Proclamation will commence the uncommenced provisions of the <i>Assisted Reproductive Technology Act 2024</i> as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> remaining regulatory provisions and provisions to support Stage 1 of the donor conception information register – 1 March 2026; provisions to support Stage 2 of the donor conception information register – 16 September 2026. <p>The Act:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> establishes a state-based framework to regulate Assisted Reproductive Technology (ART) services in Queensland; and establishes a donor conception information register in Queensland. <p>Queensland Health has assessed the Proclamation as minor and machinery in nature, as it merely commences legislation that has already been passed but is not yet in operation. In line with the Queensland Government <i>Better Regulation Policy</i>, Queensland Health has determined that the Proclamation is minor and machinery in nature as it is a declaratory provision that does not introduce new regulatory impacts and does not require regulatory impact analysis.</p>
