

Minor and machinery in nature	<p>This proposal is minor and machinery in nature as it is deregulatory and will omit sections 9, 52, 64(1) of <i>Work Health and Safety and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2024</i> (WHSOLA Act) (which have not commenced) and make minor amendments to related provisions of the <i>Work Health and Safety Act 2011</i> (WHS Act).</p> <p>If commenced, section 52 of the WHSOLA Act will insert new section 155A into the WHS Act. This proposed amendment would introduce a new administrative process requiring the work health and safety (WHS) regulator to provide information from relevant notices issued by WHS inspectors to WHS entry permit holders and health and safety representatives on request.</p> <p>Omitting sections 9 and 64(1) of the WHSOLA Act are consequential to ensure additional changes to support this information sharing power in the WHS Act and the <i>Safety in Recreational Water Activities Act 2011</i> are no longer implemented.</p> <p>Other minor and consequential amendments to related provisions in the WHS Act are also deregulatory in nature, and are proposed in order to give effect to the removal of the new administrative process.</p>
